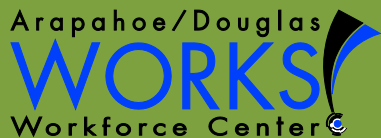

 - Arapahoe/Douglas Works! served as the Administrative Agent

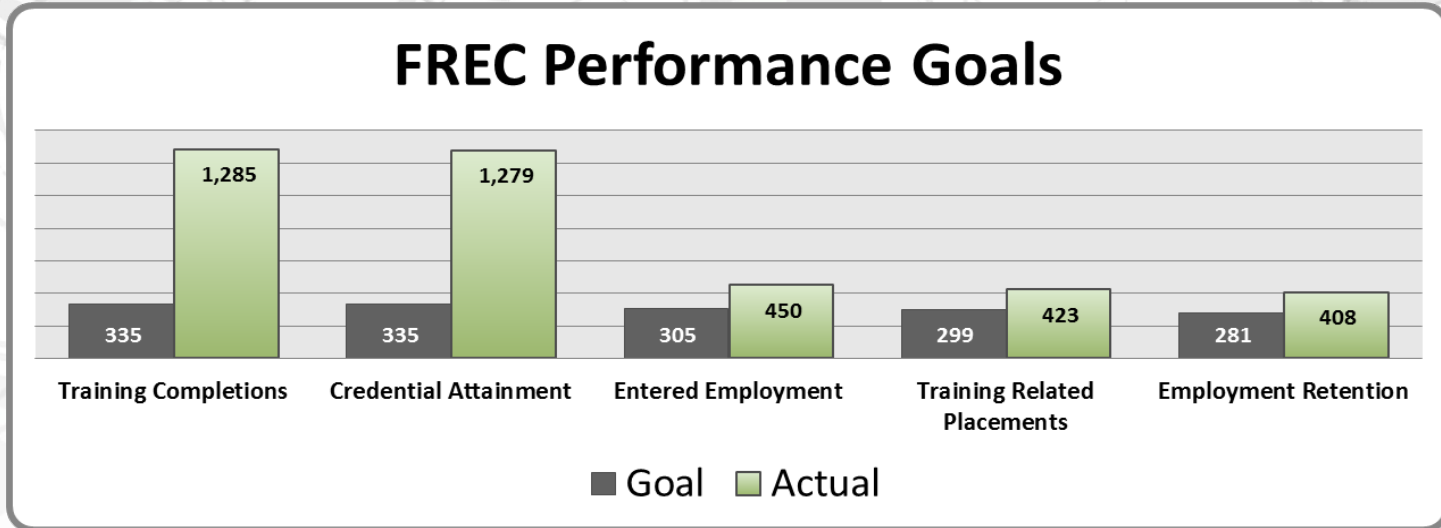

Avg. Cost per Participant:	\$1,608.19
Cost Savings:	46%
Participants served:	1,347
Employers served:	275+
Industries Most Impacted:	Construction/Manufacturing

FREC SESP Final Updates



- Each performance goal was exceeded by 44% to 283%
- The aggregate job multiplier for the SESP participants who kept their jobs was 1.98. Therefore, for every one job saved through SESP, an additional 0.98 jobs in the community were also saved.

FREC SESP Final Updates

Based on average earnings per worker in the industry groups where jobs were saved, it is estimated that over \$17.8 million stayed in the economy as demand for goods and services because of SESP, with an additional \$14.3 million from direct, indirect and induced earnings saved as a result of SESP.
