Candidates have to be at least 18 years old, a U.S. citizen, have a GED or HS diploma, and have reliable transportation. AMTAP does not require a security clearance, nor does it lead that way; however, if someone's career path at Lockheed Martin requires a security clearance, Lockheed Martin will sponsor it.
