- Peter Hancock- excited to be collaborating with other workforce development boards.
 Professional Employment Group is 8(a) certification pending. Receiving certification under the SBA 8(a) Program gives companies a great opportunity to continue to develop their business, as well as, strengthen their teaming relationships.
 - We need assistance finding meeting locations with at least 50-person minimum capacity for the Arapahoe/Douglas Workforce Development Board.
- Dr. Stephanie Fuji- excited about the opportunities that exist for us. We will be breaking ground on our Healthcare Annex building.
- Kim Tranter- we received a trade association grant from CWDC and had 4 training classes in July. We will be expanding in the Front Range and along the I-70 corridor.
 - Denver Rescue mission has 2 classes for those who are experiencing homelessness.
- Stephanie Mufic- the aerospace sector partnership has been very active. We have representation from small, medium, and large-scale employers.
 - The Business Boost Program is designed to enhance the operations and scalability of small/micro-businesses to thrive in a digital world. Eight 45-minute session recordings will be released in September.
 - We recently worked with the American Institute for Research (AIR) to become an intermediary for five Registered Apprenticeships in technology. As an intermediary, we would be able to support recruiting efforts, subsidize training costs for eligible new hires, work with the Department of Labor and submit any required paperwork. We are hoping this will entice employers to build more apprenticeships.

Arapahoe - Commissioner Warren-Gully

- Arapahoe County Fair was last week; more than 27,000 people were reported to have attended. It was the second largest attendance on record. We now have a new signature beer from Launch Pad Brewery called "Windmill Wheat."
- We have restarted a committee to help those experiencing homelessness.
- A lot of our ARPA funding went towards helping vulnerable populations.
- We will start receiving money from the <u>Opioid settlement</u> soon.
- We now have a Board of Health for the Arapahoe County Health Department.
- We have been conducting a lot of space studies and that information will be presented to our team next month.
- We have signed an MOU with the Northern Arapahoe Tribe and we'll be working with them on the Sand Creek Massacre run.
- We have a partnership with Xcel Energy; they are following our fossil fuel vehicles for 6 months and then will follow our new electric vehicles.
