

Fastest Growing Occupations Paying a *Living Wage: High School Diploma/GED

Over the next five years, the list below highlights the fastest growing occupations in the Denver Metro area that require a high school diploma or GED. It also provides valuable insights, including the entry-level wage and the median posted wage for each occupation during the most recent quarter.

The entry-level wage is the amount of money someone usually earns when they first start a job. The median posted wage is the middle amount being offered by employers posting jobs—half of the job postings offer more, and half offer less (Source: Lightcast).
