




## Unemployment & Underemployment

### Labor Force Up


The labor force in the combined Arapahoe/Douglas County area went up by 1,387 between July and August. The number of unemployed decreased to 30,235, down 3,335 (0.6%) from July.



#### Metro Area Unemployment, Underemployment & Labor Force Trends










#### Percent Small Businesses with Foreign Supplier Delays By Sector, October 4-10, 2021, United States





#### Inflation




Nationally, inflation stayed level at 5.4% in September. Consumers continue to experience spot shortages due to international supply chain issues being experienced across all sectors (see previous slide).

#### **Selected Inflation Rates**






#### **Shortages & High Recruitment Costs**



The need for workers is weighing on the trucking industry, where freight operators are struggling to raise wages fast enough to find drivers.













In September 2021, for the first time there were over 1 million unique remote job postings in the United States.



There continues to be an acute shortage in computer and healthcare workers throughout greater metro Denver. The top jobs posted remain software developers, registered nurses, and truck drivers.

#### Wage Trends in Job Postings



These differences may reflect a variety of factors: recruitment in states with lower labor costs, reluctance of some workers to return to their old jobs, and increased capital expenditures on virtual technologies and artificial intelligence to offset labor shortages. The median wage is the 'official' wage determined for greater metro Denver by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.


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


The graph and pie chart show workers immediately available through the workforce centers in greater metro Denver by occupational family and by educational attainment level.








#### Job Quits, Western United States




#### Gross Sales, All Industries
