

ONE STOP CERTIFICATION

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) specifies that the Colorado Workforce Development Council (CWDC) shall establish the minimum criteria for certification of one-stop centers and the one-stop delivery system. Certification is required to be done by local boards at least once every three years in order for one-stop centers and the one-stop delivery system to receive infrastructure funding.

Each Local Board (or the state board as applicable) should evaluate a report on the certification requirements for the one-stop delivery system and vote to certify, certify conditionally, or not certify the local one-stop delivery system. The certification report consists of the following items, as well as any criteria that have been added by the local board through a local policy:

- 1. Assessment of physical and programmatic accessibility at the following locations:
 - a. Comprehensive one-stop centers
 - b. Affiliate one-stop centers providing Title I-B (Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth) and III (Wagner-Peyser) programs, at a minimum, Assessment of effectiveness of the core (Titles I-B, II, III and IV of WIOA) programs
- Assessment of the continuous improvement efforts outlined in the local plan and reported on annually to the Colorado Workforce Development Council
 Assessment of the integration of available services across all required partners
